

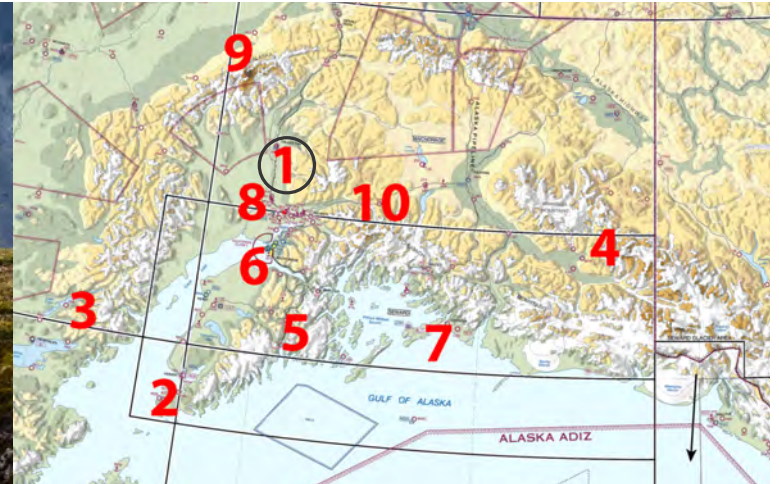

TALKEETNA

This charming pioneer town, with its own-block-long Main Street, is halfway between Anchorage to Denali, and offers tons of adventures as well as great views of Mt. Denali.

MAIN STREET

Capture the feeling of bustling small-town Alaska in a stroll down Talkeetna's Main Street, a 2-block journey through historic buildings, art shops, restaurants, coffee shops, ice cream stops and a micro-brewery.



FISHING

Alaska is a mecca for sport fishing, and thousands of anglers visit each year to throw a line into cold, clear waters. Talkeetna fishing is lesser known than other locales, which makes it a bit of an insider's secret.



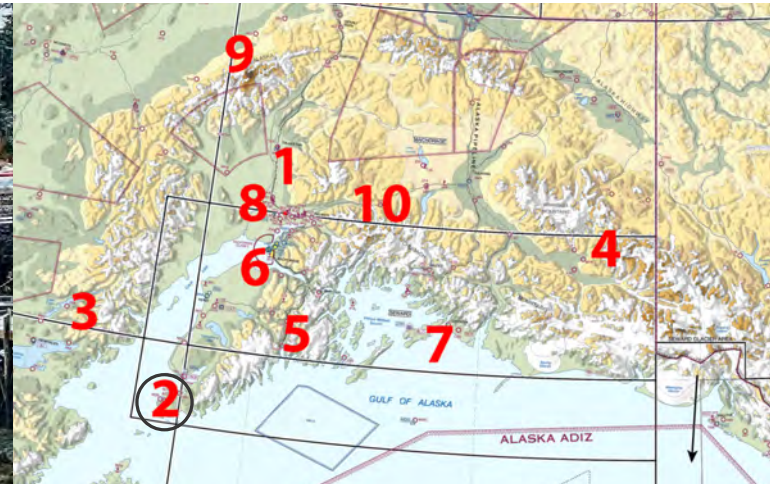
HIKING

In Seldovia, locals call their town the “City of Secluded Charm”. Set among a maze of peninsulas, straits, and lakes, the isolated community of about 300 residents and is accessible only by boat or by private charter plane.

Seldovia provides a unique opportunity to fish for Chinook or King Salmon in a remote and beautiful corner of Alaska. Chinook salmon return to the Seldovia Slough from mid-May through late June, providing sport fishing opportunities from shore, a small boat, or trolling in Seldovia Bay before they enter the slough.



MOUNTAIN BIKING

The most popular ride is a leisurely pedal along the Jakolof Bay Road, which winds 10 miles along the coast towards the head of Jakolof Bay. Along the way are panoramic views of Kachemak Bay, Kasitsna Bay, and Jakolof Bay, while McDonald Spit is a favorite spot for seabirds and marine life.



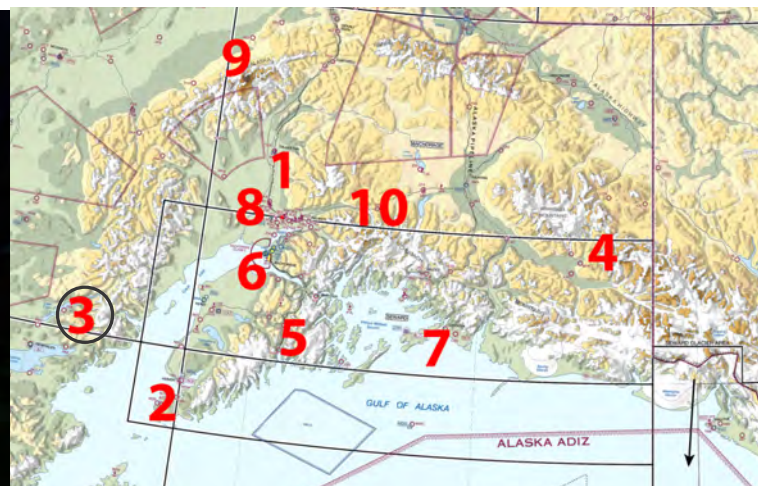
THE HOMER SPIT

BEAR VIEWING

Viewing Alaskan Brown Bears up close is a once in a lifetime experience. Accessing this remote location is a challenge in itself. We depart from the Pilot Lodge by private plane and have to time our landing on the beach to be at low tide when more sand is available. The tides in Alaska are extreme, sometimes rising and falling 25 feet in a day.

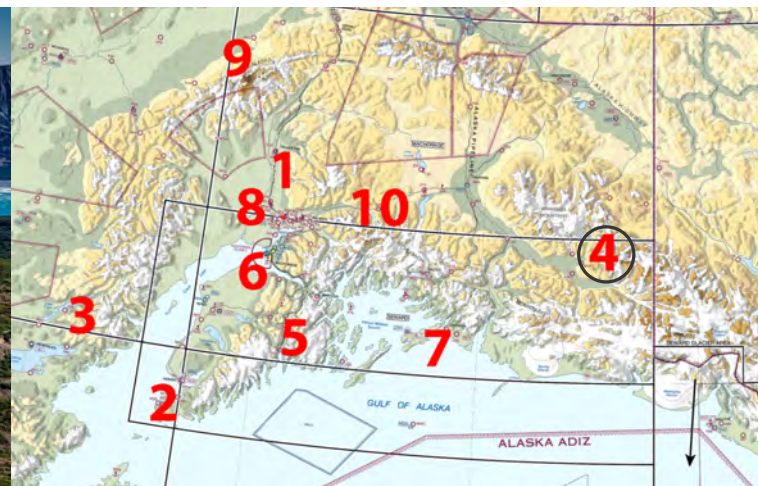


The bears here in the national park have tons of salmon, berries, and grass to eat, and are not aggressive towards people. Everyone who has made the journey to see the bears always says it was the highlight of their Alaskan adventure. The bears come out to the beaches to feed from May to September, with peak months June through August.

ABOUT

Wrangell-St. Elias is a vast national park that rises from the ocean all the way up to 18,008 ft. At 13.2 million acres, the park is the same size as Yellowstone National Park, Yosemite National Park, and Switzerland combined! Within this wild landscape, people continue to live off the land as they have done for centuries.

There is no shortage of places to land in the National Park. Expect to fly over many glaciers, land on gravels bars, riverbanks, tundra, and some high altitude strips.

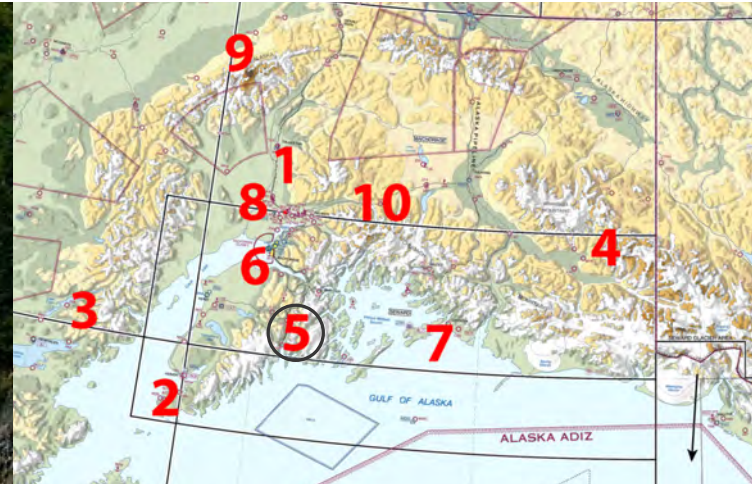


PUBLIC USE CABINS

ABOUT

At the edge of the Kenai Peninsula lies a land where the ice age lingers.

Nearly 40 glaciers flow from the Harding Icefield, Kenai Fjords' crowning feature. Wildlife thrives in icy waters and lush forests along the fjords once carved by the vast expanse of ice. Today, shrinking glaciers bear witness to the effects of our changing climate.

HARDING ICEFIELD

The 8.2-mile round trip Harding Icefield Trail is a spectacular day hike leaving from the Exit Glacier Area. The top of the trail is a window to past ice ages - a horizon of ice and snow that stretches as far as the eye can see, broken only by an occasional nunatak, or lonely peak.



KAYAKING

Paddling in Kenai Fjords can be a once in a lifetime experience. By dipping your paddle into these waters, you're participating in the long history of human powered travel along the Kenai Peninsula coast. You can experience the awe-inspiring power of a tidewater glacier, while dipping a hand into these frigid waters.

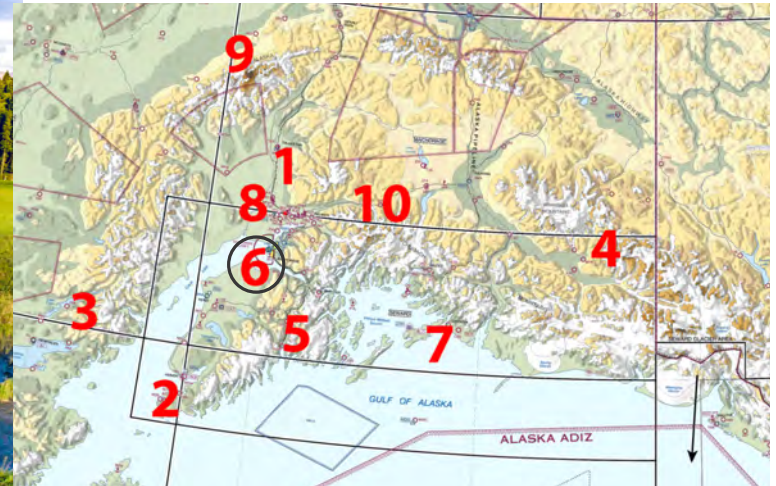

ABOUT

Pincher Creek Cabin is a rustic 14' x 16' log cabin located on the eastern shore of Pincher Creek within the Chickaloon Bay Tidal Flats area.

PINCHER CREEK CABIN

Built in the summer of 2008, this cabin offers seclusion, hiking, photography, and waterfowl hunting. The cabin contains two bunk beds, a table with benches, wood stove, splitting maul, crosscut saw, broom, shovel, fire extinguisher, and a 'GO Anywhere Toilet Kit'-compatible outhouse. In the winter there is cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Access to the cabin is by airplane on wheels or skis.

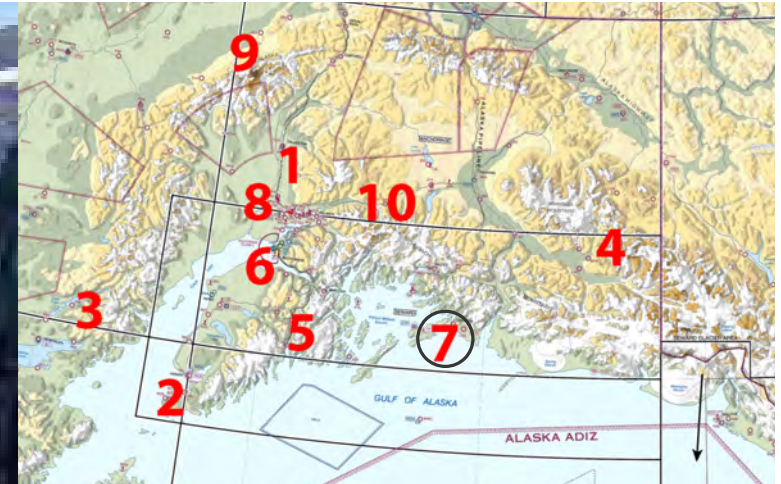
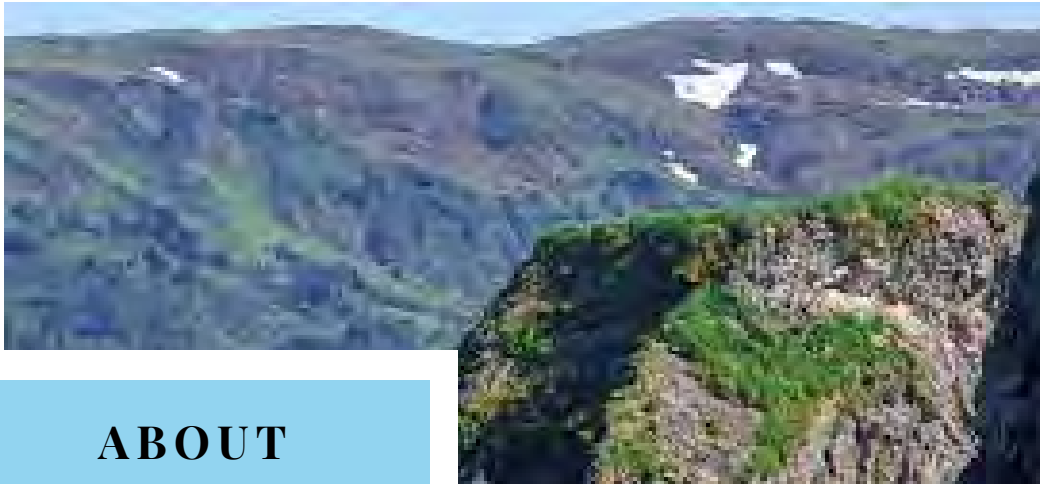

Hook Point Cabin is situated 1.5 miles west of Hook Point on Hinchinbrook Island in the Chugach National Forest. Visitors to the cabin will find many opportunities for recreation and relaxation in the vicinity. Fishing, hunting, beachcombing, hiking and wildlife viewing are all easily accessible from the site.

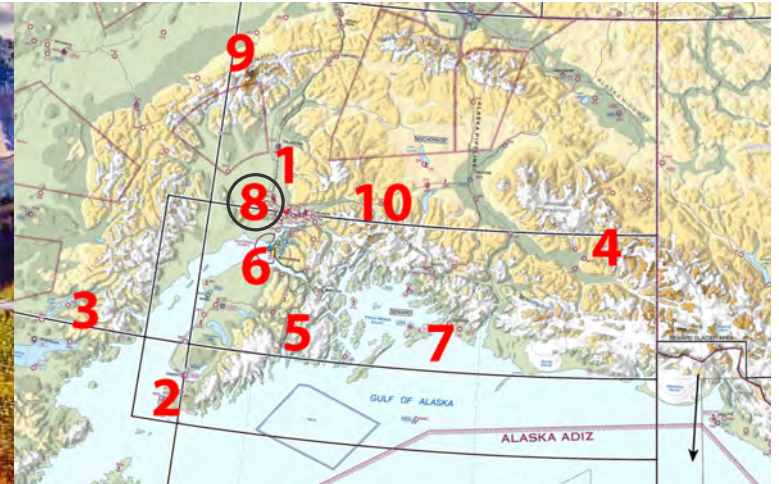
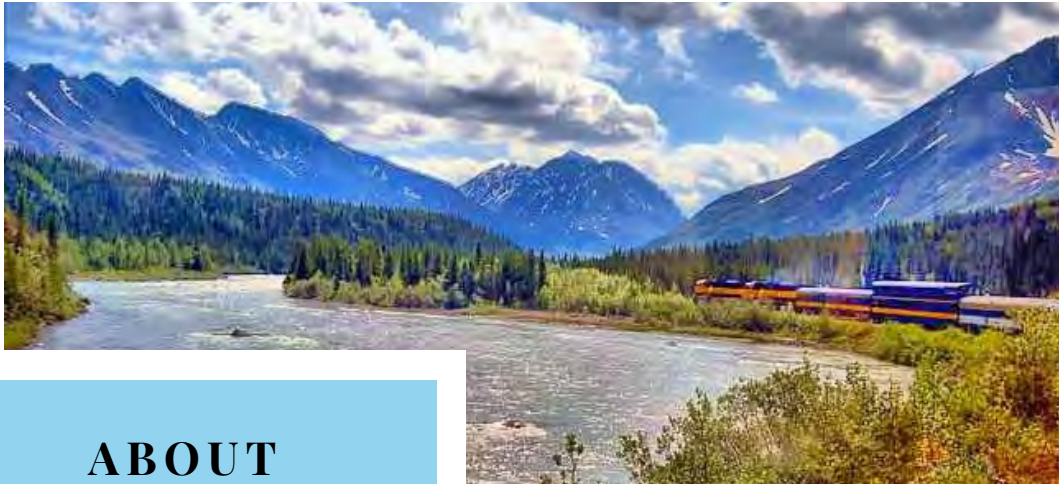
SURFING

Montague and Hinchinbrook Islands both have some of Alaska's most ridden waves. Hinchinbrook is home to several cobblestone trestles-like setups. Tucked high in the Gulf of Alaska, it is the northernmost surfing locale in the Pacific Ocean, and on big winter days this becomes painfully obvious.

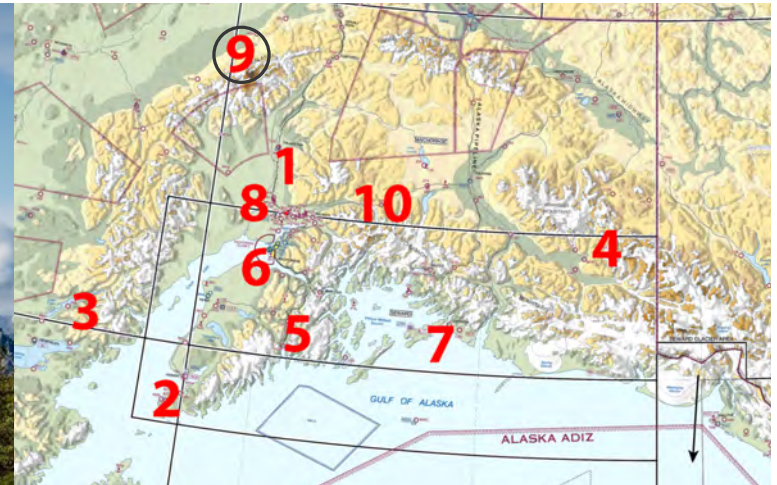


FISHING

The Susitna River Drainage is the primary river system that flows into upper Cook Inlet. It's a long, winding river system comprised of a myriad of tributaries that flow from deep within interior Alaska. Most of the waterways offer excellent fishing. The smaller rivers, which flow into the Susitna River, provide fishing opportunities both upstream and at their confluences.

Denali is six million acres of wild land, bisected by one ribbon of road. Wild animals large and small roam unfenced lands, living as they have for ages. Solitude, tranquility and wilderness await.

DENALI NATIONAL PARK

The granite peaks and snowy summits of Denali National Park and Preserve cover 160 miles of the Alaska Range and are so tall they are often lost in the clouds. Dominating this stunning landscape is Denali - the highest peak in North America. Denali majestically ascends 20,310 feet and is one of the most awe-inspiring sights in Alaska.



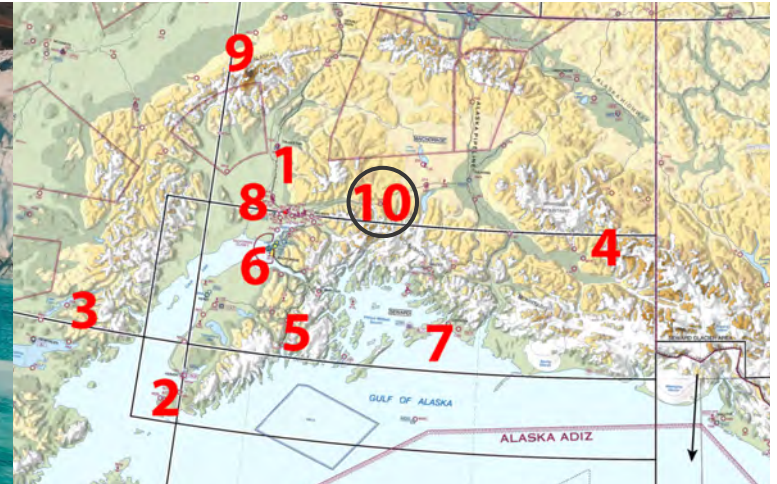
HIKING + BACKPACKING

For many, Denali offers the opportunity to escape into the backcountry for a true Alaska wilderness experience. Thanks to Denali's rigid restrictions and permits, backpackers can trek and camp in a slice of wilderness all on their own, even if it's just for a couple of days. Since the park has few designated hiking trails, the main way to explore on foot is by backcountry hiking over open terrain such as gravel riverbeds and tundra ridges.

The Knik Glacier is an ice field located 50 miles east of Anchorage. The ice field averages over 25 miles long and over 5 miles across, making it one of the largest glaciers in southcentral Alaska.
